


George Orwell is one of Britain's best-known authors of the **20**<sup>th</sup> century, responsible for such famous works as *Animal Farm* and **1984**. However, there was a period in his life when things didn't go so well for him.

In the hope of a better job and more money, Orwell moves to working in a restaurant, but the owner doesn't pay him for **10** days and so he's reduced to sleeping on a park bench rather than facing his landlady over non-payment of rent.

......(3) He blames the dreadful existence of the fellow workers for turning them all into zombies, "[They have] been trapped by a routine which makes thought impossible. If [they] thought at all, they would long ago have ... gone on strike for better treatment. But they do not think, because they have no leisure for it; their life has made slaves of them."

Orwell travels to London having been promised that a job is waiting for him. However, he can't start work because his new employer has gone on holiday. .......(4)
