- C Celebrity chefs don't just make money. They can make important changes to the way we think about food and the food we buy. 11-Reading 2:

A Few of the Most Unusual Schools in the World

Most students arrive at school in the morning, bookbag in hand, and return home in the afternoon with an armful of homework and stories. They come back the next day to sit in rows of wooden desks facing a blackboard while the teacher writes down the answers to their assignments in white chalk. This is what comes to mind for many of us when we think of schools. However, some schools are a little different than we expect.

Dongzhong Mid-Cave Primary School

The Dongzhong Mid-Cave Primary School is located in a cave in Miao village in China. Dongzhong means "in cave." Guizhou is one of China's poorest villages and receives very little government support. Instead of using resources to build a school building, the community started the cave school in 1984 with eight teachers and 186 students. Some students spend up to six hours daily to travel to and from the school in order to get an education.

The Train Platform Schools of India

There are many poor kids in India. Instead of taking these children to school, Khurana, a teacher, decided to take the school to the children. More than 4,000 students are being educated around India. The schools educate street children, child laborers, and children from poor families. The children gather between train stops to learn, to read and write.

Gulu Elementary School

Gulu is a little-known village located in the mountains of China. The only way to get to the village is through the Luoma Way, which is filled with zigzag turns, narrow passages between rock walls, and old bridges.

The school has been around since the late '80s and is run by one teacher, Shen Qijun. It's very dangerous and tiring to get to the school, yet many students head to school every day!
